



Emergency Procedure

YOU MUST CALL EMERGENCY SERVICES IF:

- You know it's the child's FIRST seizure
- If the seizure has not stopped after 5 minutes, or has lasted longer than is usual for them
- If one seizure follows another without the child regaining consciousness in-between
- If the child's IHP advises you to do so in the current situation
- If emergency medication has been given

You should also call for an ambulance if the child is injured, is having problems breathing, or if you think they need urgent medical attention for ANY reason.

A member of staff must stay with the child until their parents or guardians arrive. The member of staff may need to accompany the child in the ambulance if the parents or guardians don't arrive in time.

If a seizure lasts for more than 30 minutes or the child doesn't regain consciousness between repeated seizures, there's a serious risk of brain damage.
